

ELEANOR TUFTS BOOK AWARD

Each year, the Award Committee of the American Society for Hispanic Art Historical Studies invites nominations for the Eleanor Tufts Prize for a distinguished book in English on the history of art and architecture in Iberia. The Eleanor Tufts Award was established in 1992 to honor Professor Tuft's contributions to the study of Spanish art history. The annual award recognizes an outstanding English language publication in the area of Spanish or Portuguese art history.

The criteria for the award are as follows:

- The subject of the book must be some aspect of the history of art and architecture in Iberia. A publication treating a broader subject will be eligible for the award only if an aspect of Iberian art and architectural history is its primary concern.
- The book must have appeared during the two calendar years preceding the award year. Thus, publications that appeared in 2008 and 2009 are eligible for the 2010 award.
- The book must be in the English language. (An English translation of a work that first appeared in another language is eligible for consideration.)
- The book may be in any format: a monograph, an exhibition catalogue, a reference book, etc.
- In evaluating eligible works, the Award Committee will seek to identify the publication that best manifests originality of conception, thoroughness of research, rigor of argument, brilliance of insight, significance of findings, and clarity of expression.

Deadline for receipt of books: December 15 each year.
